CONTEXT, OBJECTIVES AND METHODOLOGY

Context, Objectives & Methodology



Fondation Émergence mandated Léger to survey Quebecers and Canadians on various topics related to the fight against homophobia and transphobia.



A **Web survey** was conducted with a representative sample of **Canadians**.

WHO?

Representative sample of **1,546 respondents** who are **English**- or **French**-speaking, and **18 years of age or older**.

WHEN?

Data was collected from February 4 to 6, 2022.



Using statistics from the latest Statistics Canada census, results were weighted according to age, language, gender, region, education and the presence of children in the household.

HOW TO READ THIS REPORT

ROUNDING

Since data presented in tables has been rounded up, column totals might differ from 100%.

SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCES

In graphics and tables presented, data in **bold green** indicate a significantly **higher** proportion than that of other respondents. Inversely, data in **bold red** indicate a proportion significantly **lower** than that of other respondents. The green and red arrows (\uparrow and \checkmark) indicate statistically significant variations from the results obtained in 2021 or 2016, where applicable.

KEY FINDINGS



GREATER CONTACT WITH THE LGBTQ+ COMMUNITY, LEADS TO BETTER UNDERSTANDING AND ACCEPTANCE.

- Among the people they know, three quarters of Canadians (74%) know at least one LGBTQ+ person. On average, Quebecers (80%) and 18-to-54-year-olds (77%) know more LGBTQ+ people than other groups of respondents.
- Overall, in 2022, most Canadians (82%) think that LGBTQ+ people are very (16%) or somewhat (66%) well accepted by their loved ones. However, two in ten Canadians (18%) think that LGBTQ+ people are not very well accepted by their loved ones. Among others, this proportion is higher among respondents who don't know any LGBTQ+ people (29%), allophone respondents (25%) and residents of Manitoba and Saskatchewan (27%).
- Three quarters (76%) of Canadians would very (39%) or somewhat easily accept (36%) if someone they knew told them they were trans. This proportion is notably higher among those who know an LGBTQ+ person (81%) and among those who have witnessed harmful behaviour towards an LGBTQ+ person (82%). It is also higher among Quebecers (84%), while the rest of Canada is less likely to accept this news.
- Most Canadians (71%) perceive LGBTQ+ people as having the same life expectancy as heterosexual people. However, one in four Canadians (27%) believe that LGBTQ+ people have a shorter life expectancy. This proportion is higher among younger people (18-to-34-year-olds (33%) and students (45%)), respondents with a university education (34%) and Anglophones (30%).
- More than half of Canadians think it is very or somewhat difficult for homosexual seniors to be open about their romantic relationship, especially in senior communities, such as CHSLDs or residences (63%). This proportion is higher among those 55 years of age and over (67%).

KEY FINDINGS

CANADIANS PLACE A GREAT DEAL OF IMPORTANCE ON SEXUAL AND GENDER DIVERSITY TRAINING. AWARENESS OF THE INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST HOMOPHOBIA AND TRANSPHOBIA IS ON AN UPWARD TREND.

- Half of Canadians (51%) say they have witnessed at least one type of harmful behaviour towards LGBTQ+ people, whether physical violence (12%), verbal violence (29%), and especially derogatory comments or mockery on the Internet and social media (47%). Among others, the proportion of witnesses is higher among people who know an LGBTQ+ person (60%).
- Most Canadians say it is important to provide formal, structured training on sexual and gender diversity. The main settings where training is needed are health (83%), school (82%), work (80%), as well as community and associative (80%) environments. For LGBTQ+ people, training is particularly important in these environments, as well as in sports environments (90%).
- One quarter of Canadians (25% vs. 22% in 2021) have heard about the International Day Against Homophobia and Transphobia. This proportion is higher among Quebecers (48%). For Quebecers, this is a significant increase from the 2021 edition of this annual study.
- One in ten Canadians (9%) is familiar with Fondation Émergence. This proportion is higher among Quebecers (16%), people who have heard of the International Day Against Homophobia and Transphobia (20%), and LGBTQ+ people (24%), among others. However, only 2% of Canadians know what the Foundation does.









REACTION TO A TRANS PERSON IN THEIR IMMEDIATE CIRCLE














